National Land Afforestation Drive

Forests are the home of plant ecosystem and water that are essential to the existence of each and every living thing. They provide our lives with unlimited blessings and benefits. These include enrichment of water resources, conservation of national land, prevention of global warming, provision of services for health and recreation, and production of timber.

Recently, the people of Japan have sought more diversified services from forests, with the wish to realize lifestyles which provide a sense of genuine abundance and ease. At the same time, people of the world have been increasingly interested in environmental conservation on a global scale and deeply recognized the importance of forests.

With the afforestation drive, we promote tree planting and greening activities in forest lands, which could be considered as common properties of mankind, in the form of wide-ranging civic initiatives all over the country and across the borders. Thereby, we contribute to the realization of lifestyles rich in spirit, cultural progress for the country of Japan, and conservation of the global environment.

National Land Afforestation Promotion Organization

The National Land Afforestation Promotion Organization (NALAPO) was originally established as the National Greening Promotion Committee in January 1950 and served as the core organization to boost the national afforestation drive in the form of civic initiatives, with diversified participation from all spheres and levels of the Japanese society. In September 1967, the committee was incorporated. In March 1988, it set up the Funds for Forests and Water and was renamed to NALAPO. In July 2011, the organization undertook a fresh beginning with new status as a Public Service Corporation under the new public service organization system.

The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the House of Councilors serve respectively as the President and the Supreme Advisor of the organization. The Representative Director is Dr. Junichi Hamada, Honorary Professor of the University of Tokyo, and NALAPO is composed of 82 regular member organizations with voting rights at the General Assembly, and further 44 supporting member organizations as of April 2022. Among the regular members are 47 Prefectural Greening Promotion Committees, which promote afforestation in respective prefectures.

An Extract from Articles of Incorporation of the National Land Afforestation Promotion Organization

Article 3 Objectives

This corporation aims, with the national afforestation drive, to establish forest resources, to conserve national land, to cultivate water resources and to plant trees in living environments. Thereby, it intends to enrich the lifestyles of Japanese citizens, to advance the Japanese culture and to conserve the global environment for its international contributions.

Greenery Festivals

■ National Tree Planting Festival

National Tree Planting Festival is held with the participation of people from the whole country in each spring, as a core event of the national land afforestation drive. The festival is attended by Their Majesties the Emperor and Empress of Japan.

Their Majesties plant seedlings and sow seeds by hand alongside other participants. Planted seeds are nurtured carefully and grown trees will be transplanted on public land.

National Land Afforestation Campaign

■ National Afforestation Campaign

The National Afforestation Campaigns are carried out from January through May, with afforestation awareness programs, fundraising events for the Greenery Donation Funds and various PR activities jointly. Those aim to enhance interest in the national afforestation drive among the people at large and to appeal for their participation in the "Afforestation by Public Partnership" movement.

Many people participate in afforestation events and come in touch with trees and forests firsthand. Those events are held all over the country from southern regions to northern districts accompanying development of new green leaves in spring.

The Funds are important tools for the Afforestation by Public Partnership drive and link contributors in cities to volunteers working in forests.

Money contributed to the Greenery Donation Funds is used for afforestation activities by volunteer groups. Those activities include conservation of biodiversity, childhood education in forests, contribution to SDGs and realization of Carbon Neutrality.

Various Ways for Donation

Anybody can contribute to the Greenery Donation Funds by various ways such as donation boxes on checkout counters in supermarkets or convenience stores, purchase of goods with donation, vending machines for charity and fund-raising on the Internet(on-line transfer) as well as in the neighborhood or schools.

As mobile payment is getting popularity, NALAPO also started to use applications for smartphone in its fund-raising activities. "J-Coin Pay" application, which covers more than 70 banks in Japan, enable account holders to contribute to the Funds from its " ぽちっと募金 " menu.

Afforestation by Public Partnership

Funds for Forests and Water

In March 1988, the Funds for Forests and Water (current name since July 1, 2011) has been deployed for Afforestation by Public Partnership movement.

Profits from the Funds are used for public awareness activities to facilitate participation of people in forest-related activities, surveys and research on public functions of woodlands including relationship between forests and water, and international exchange related to afforestation promotion. These initiatives aim to develop an understanding on afforestation and obtain cooperation by public.

Green Scouts

The Green Scouts have been established to nurture the spirit and will to love, protect and foster greenery through activities in forests among children, who will be next leaders in afforestation movements. The National Green Scouts Federation (as of January 1, 2021) consists of 3,168 organizations with over 320,000 members.

The Green Scouts are actively engaged in activities such as interactive nature experiences in forests, public service activities, camping and other recreational activities, making use of various regional characteristics. Activity presentations and exchange meetings by Green Scouts members selected nationwide, and Green Scouts leaders training sessions are held to encourage autonomous activities by the Green Scouts.

Afforestation by Public Partnership

Support for Afforestation from SDGs-conscious Corporations and NPOs

Expansion of Afforestation by Public Partnership movement supported by general citizens rather than by only people working in forests and environment areas will contribute to realization of SDGs effectively.

Therefore, NALAPO tries to disseminate Four Actions for Forests, namely Touch Forests, Use Wood, Support Forests and Live in Forests. It also holds training seminars for forest volunteer leaders, provides information on forest volunteer activities and facilitates matching between corporations, forest owners and NPOs to support afforestation activities by corporation and NPOs.
